Following on from this point, Rogers and Faulkener show what an enormous difference social worker involvement can make to the disposal of these patients. At the police station studied, where patients were routinely assessed by a social worker, no patient was admitted to hospital under Section 136, 28% were immediately discharged and 40% were admitted informally. At the psychiatric hospital 91% of police referrals were actually admitted under Section 136, only 2% were immediately discharged and 4% were admitted informally. The case for social worker involvement becomes clear. Without it many

patients may be needlessly admitted to psychiatric hospitals.

This short book contains many other important findings and illustrates several areas where both action and further research are needed. It should be read by all professionals involved in the implementation and assessment of patients on Section 136.
