On 11 July 1897, Andrée and two companions — Nils Strindberg and Knut Frankel — departed from Danskøya in the balloon <i>Örnen</i> in an attempt to reach the North Pole. Three days later, some 300 km northeast of Svalbard, the men abandoned the flight and started hauling sledges south. On 5 October, 100 years ago this month, the men made the first known landing on Kvitøya. It is probable that they died soon thereafter, and nothing was known of their fate until 1930, when a Norwegian expedition discovered their camp and recovered their bodies, diaries, and other possessions.
