## THE CONTRIBUTORS

ROBERT C. TUCKER, formerly an attaché of the American Embassy in Moscow, has been engaged in research in the Social Science Division of The RAND Corporation since 1954. A specialist in Soviet politics and ideology, he is at present making a study of the changing patterns of Soviet foreign policy.

OTTO KIRCHHEIMER joined the Graduate Faculty of the New School for Social Research in New York as Professor of Political Science in 1955. Prior to that, he spent ten years as an analyst and branch chief in the Department of State's Office of Intelligence Research. He contributed to *World Politics* in April 1951 and April 1954.

DANIEL WIT is Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Michigan and Director of the Michigan Memorial-Phoenix Project #107, which is concerned with the international implications of atomic power development. He expects to be in Bangkok for the next two years as a member of the University of Indiana-Thailand Public Administration Program. Among his publications is *Comparative Political Institutions* (1953).

HERBERT B. WOOLLEY is directing a study of the structure of world trade and payments at the National Bureau of Economic Research under a Ford Foundation grant, and reports some of the fruits of this research in the current issue of *World Politics*. He was previously Director of the Trade Analysis staff of the Mutual Security Agency and, still earlier, an economist in the Department of State.

HAROLD D. LASSWELL, Professor of Law and Political Science at Yale University, has been a fellow of the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford during the past year. Co-author, with Abraham Kaplan, of *Power and Society* (1949) and, with Daniel Lerner, of *The Policy Sciences* (1951), he is an advisory editor of *World Politics*.

WARNER R. SCHILLING is Research Associate in the Institute of War and Peace Studies at Columbia University and Lecturer in Government at Columbia College. He is engaged in a study of the foreign policy premises of American naval policy in World War I and is taking part in the Institute's research project on civil-military relations.

CHARLES BOASSON, a practicing lawyer in Jerusalem, is a guest lecturer at the Jerusalem School of Political Science and at the Tel Aviv School of Law and Economics. The author of *Sociological Aspects of Law and International Adjustment* (1950) and a contributor to *Research for Peace*, sponsored by the Institute for Sociological Research in Oslo (1954), he is preparing a study entitled *Between Anxiety and Action*.
