The scope of the Journal is the study of Latin America from the standpoint of the social sciences (including history and international relations). Articles on literature and the arts are not normally included, but the editors are pleased to consider contributions in the field of intellectual and cultural history. Articles with an inter-disciplinary approach are particularly welcome.

Contributions are invited from all parts of the world. Articles should generally not be more than 8000 words long. Two copies typed with double spacing should be submitted. A style sheet is available from the editors. The Journal is published in English, but articles may also be submitted in Spanish or Portuguese; if the article is accepted, translation into English will be the responsibility of the author. Tables, diagrams and maps may be included by arrangement with the editors. The Journal only publishes original contributions; translations of articles already published will not be accepted. Each contributor will receive, free of charge, 25 offprints of the article and a copy of the issue of the Journal in which it appears.

The Journal publishes book reviews in each issue. Not all books received can be reviewed and editorial policy gives preference to substantial reviews of books regarded as of major importance for the disciplines covered by the Journal.
