## CURRENT RESEARCH INVENTORY

A detailed annotated bibliography covering all of the social sciences and humanities fields as these relate to Latin America in general and to each nation there. Included are descriptions of all types of reference tools and definitive monographs, some periodical articles and conference proceedings. Many items were published in Latin America and some in Europe. There are sections on the topic of Latin American Studies as a field, on biography, and a section on Spanish-speaking residents of the U.S.A. At the end are directories of Latin American Studies Programs, research centers, associations, government agencies, foundations information centers, publishers, book dealers and periodicals agents, international in scope. ### Latin American Jewry: A Research Guide

An international bibliography, covering books, reference materials, pamphlets, periodical articles, government documents, conference proceedings, manuscripts, diaries, correspondence, synagogue records and other primary sources, covering the period 1492 to the present, published in Europe and the Western Hemisphere, in 11 languages. The topic in general as well as in all of its aspects (history, geography, economics, politics, sociology, anthropology, folklore, language, publishing, art, theatre, etc.) are covered, for Latin America in general and for each nation and region (sub-region) of the area. Work was done in archives and libraries in the USA, Spain, France, and Israel. Some 6,000 entries are included. At the end are directories of synagogues, religious schools, periodical titles, fraternal associations, university centers and archives, as well as social centers. Begun, 1971. EDC, 1975.
