

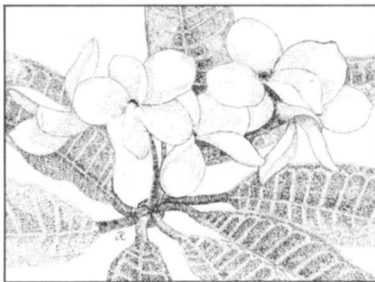

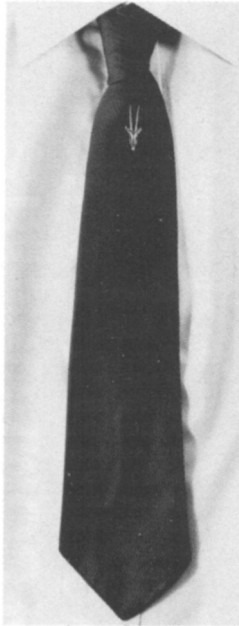

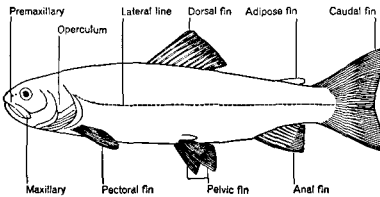

**Filmy Fern** (Filicales: *Hymenophyllum*). Two delicate, moss-like small ferns, growing on damp rocks in the north and west: *H. tunbrigense* and *H. wilsonii*. The allied Killarney or Bristle Fern *Trichomanes speciosum* is now very rare in west Ireland.

**Fimbriate**. Botanical adjective used of leaves or other organs with fringed margins.

**Fin**. A group of spines linked by a membrane. For nomenclature of a fish's fins, ♀ below.



**Finch** (Passeriformes: Fringillidae). Small thick-billed seed-eating song birds, often flocking together in winter. Bramble Finch ♀ BRAMBLING; Bullfinch; cardueline finch, a member of the genus *Carduelis*, viz. goldfinch, linnet, redpoll, siskin, twite; Chaffinch; Citril Finch *C. citrinella*, a very rare straggler; Goldfinch, Greenfinch, Hawfinch.

**Flinner**. Seaman's name for the porpoise.

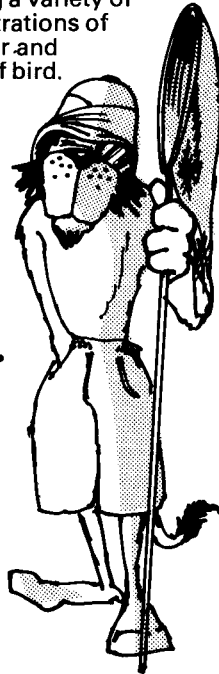

## Low Cost High Quality Units

A complete and exacting new range of extremely high quality night vision components, designed for the field biologists, or indeed anyone wishing to observe the nocturnal wildlife that abounds.

**Still on introductory offer of £850\* sterling**, is the new world acclaimed 'Night Keeper' three stage cascade image intensifier. A hand held viewer, designed for long range high resolution viewing at night (Image Intensifiers are normally in excess of £2000, in fact the 'Night Keeper' and the 'Night Cat' out perform many costing £4000 or more).

The unit shown on the left is the 'Night Cat' high resolution hand viewer fitted with a 95mm f1.2 Catadioptric lens and the Infra-Red Laser. Photographic, video and movie camera adapters are available to fit the above.

**Low Light High Speed photographic lenses**, not available on the normal photographic market are also available, together with thermal radiation detectors for the automatic switching of cameras etc.

Image Intensifiers do not normally require extra Infra-Red illumination. They amplify, many thousands of times, the small amount of ambient light available, even on moonless nights in winter and give clear pictures of the surrounding landscape.

The 'Night Cat' and the 'Night Keeper' can even be supplied completely radio controlled, with pan, tilt, zoom etc; transmitting their own T.V. picture to a remote monitor by UHF or VHF radio. This unit is effectonately known as K9.

The company also specialises in radio telemetry for mammal tracking and 'bugging'.
