The annual institutional subscription rate is \$30.00, postage included. Subscribers also receive the annual *Bibliography and Professional Review*. Single issues of the *Journal and Bibliography*, beginning with the May 1965 issue, cost \$8.00 plus postage and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Earlier issues may be purchased from A.M.S. Reprints, 56 E. 13th Street, New York, New York 10003.

Annual membership dues are \$20.00 (\$10.00 for full-time students) payable April 1. Regular and student members receive the *Journal of Asian Studies*, the annual *Bibliography of Asian Studies*, the *Asian Studies Professional Review*, and the *Asian Studies Newsletter*. Second-class postage paid at Ann Arbor, Michigan and at Richmond, Virginia.

Individual and back issues of the *Journal and Bibliography* to the membership cost \$6.00 plus postage for regular members, and \$4.00 plus postage for student members. Nicholas, Editor, *Journal of Asian Studies*, The University of Chicago, 1126 E. 59th St., Chicago, Illinois 60637. Manuscripts should be typed on 8 1/2 × 11 bond, double-spaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the Style Sheet of the MLA (available from the Secretariat in Ann Arbor), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
