THE proceeds of the Prestwich and Barlow-Jameson Funds have been allocated by the Council to meet part of the expenditure on the Society's publications. The Daniel-Pidgeon Fund for 1923 has been awarded to Mr. Howel Williams, of Liverpool University, for researches on the Stratigraphy and Vulcanicity of Snowdon, and a grant of £25 has been made from the Gloyne Fund for work on the bone-caves of Gower, under the superintendence of Professor W. J. Sollas.
