An Introduction to the Study of **Ecclesiastical Latin**

By H. P. V. NUNN

In the twenty years since the publication of the second edition of this work, it has held its ground as the best of its kind. It is intended mainly for those who come to the study of Latin after leaving school with a view to the better understanding of theological terms and Church authors.

It consists of a syntax laying special stress on the idioms to be found in the Vulgate, in some of the Latin Fathers and in mediaeval writers.

BOOKS ON THE LITURGY

A HISTORY OF THE DOMINICAN LITURGY 1215-1945

By Rev. W. R. Bonniwell, O.P. 432 pages. 12 Illustrations 30s. 0d.

Only three serious works have been published on the Dominican rite: Cavalieri's in 1686, Cassito's in 1804 and Rousseau's in 1926. They were either incomplete or unreliable. Fr Bonniwell spent twenty years of arduous research in the preparation of his book. He is a sure guide through the mazes of conflicting interpretations of various aspects of the subject, and he has solved numerous vexing questions.

THE LITURGY OF THE MASS

By Dr P. Parsch. 15th impression. 368 pages. 22s. 6d.

The author takes each ceremony individually and in turn, locates it in the historical process of development, explains its original symbolism or meaning, and then adds an appreciation of its relation to the exquisite dramatic whole that is the Roman Mass.
