**BALANCE OF PAYMENTS PROBLEMS OF A DEVELOPING COUNTRY: TANZANIA.** MICHAEL YAFFEY African Studies No. 47, 290 pp., 142 tables. Hard cover, DM 48,-. Economic, statistical and political aspects of Tanzania's transactions with the rest of the world. The author is presently manager of the Financial Analysis Department of Air Products Ltd., New Malden England.

**STATUS AND USE OF AFRICAN LINGUA FRANCA.** BERND HEINE African Studies No. 49, 206 pp., 5 maps. Hard cover, DM 34,-. Only few of the almost thousand different languages and dialects in Africa have been able to develop beyond a regionally limited area into a lingua franca. The present study gives a first insight into the history and present-day importance of African lingua francas. The author establishes a link between the languages discussed and social, cultural, economic and political factors and at the same time gives an impression of the variety of African lingua francas some of which are already playing a new and important role in the African nations of today.

**STUDIES IN PRODUCTION AND TRADE IN EAST AFRICA.** PAUL ZAJADACZ African Studies No. 51, 441 pp., 86 tables, 5 maps, 3 diagrams. Hard cover, DM 68,-. Investigations into various branches of production and trade in the three East African countries Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda are combined in this book: structural analyses of industrial sectors and trade, studies on crafts and small-scale industries and on the role of Marketing Boards. The investigations either deal with the whole of East Africa or with only one country. The inclusion of political and social aspects leads to a better understanding of the frequently complex interrelationships of the subjects under discussion.

The main emphasis is upon the peoples and policies, the problems and progress of this dynamic and disparate continent; upon the many societies that are evolving rather than the essential characteristics of the old; upon the present, not on the more distant past. The best current work is sought from specialists in different academic disciplines, whose contributions can illuminate and cross-fertilise one another.

The Journal seeks to promote a deeper understanding of what is happening in Africa today. It is intended for both the political scientist and the practical politician, the administrator and the advocate, the economist and the educator, the banker and the businessman, the diplomat and the technocrat, the civil servant and the nationalist leader. All have something to contribute to these pages and, it is hoped, much to learn from them.

Editorial policy avoids commitment to any political viewpoint or ideology, whether imperialism, pan-Africanism, capitalism, socialism, or nationalism. Such concepts, however, have relevance to the modern African situation, and merit serious discussion, often from several different points of view, in order that controversial issues may be fairly examined.
