Rabad of Posquieres

The achievement of Rabad of Posquières—Rabbi Abraham ben David—during the Jewish scholarly renaissance of 12th-century Provence has never been fully appreciated, although his criticism of Maimonides has been generally recognized. In this book, Rabad's personality, his role in Jewish intellectual history, and his subsequent influence are analyzed; his following, his reaction to Spanish-Judaic philosophic literature, and his relation to the emerging medieval kabbalah are described. \$7.50

John Jewel and the Problem of Doctrinal Authority

By W. M. Southgate. A primary challenge to the Church of England in the 16th century was the construction of a theory of doctrinal authority. Bishop John Jewel, in his *Apology*—the first systematic defense of the Anglican Church in Elizabeth's reign—sought a comprehensive answer to the problem and thus laid the foundation for later, more definitive work. Mr. Southgate presents the Bishop's life in historical context, establishing a basis for theoretical analysis; in Part II he examines the "Problem of Doctrinal Authority," cogently contributing to our understanding of the Church of England's development. \$4.75

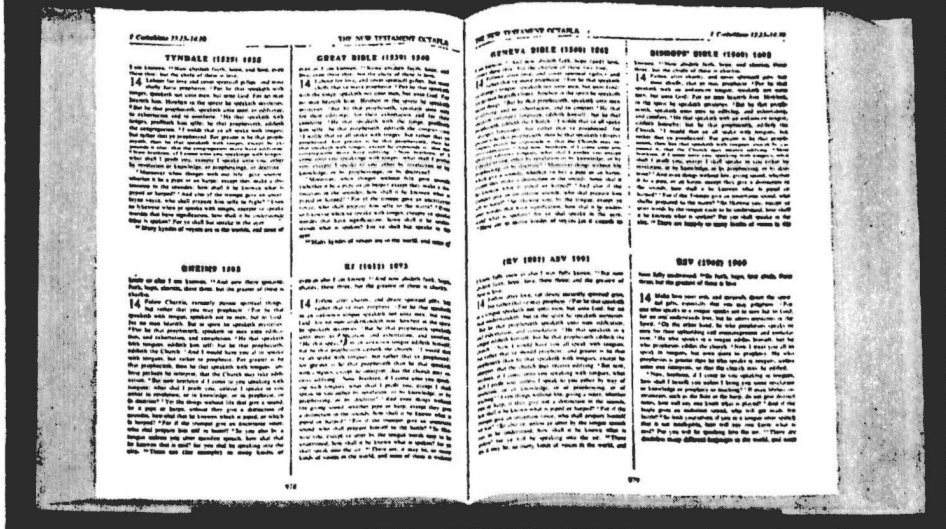
The Judgements of Joan
