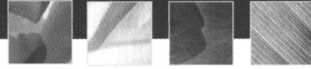


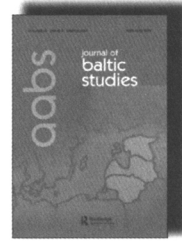

Preference is given to original contributions that are of general scholarly interest.

The Editor invites submissions of original material for consideration as articles, usually 5000-10,000 words in length. Authors are responsible for observing the laws of copyright when quoting or reproducing material and for any reproduction fees incurred.
