## **Epidemics and Mortality in Early Modern Japan**

Ann Jannetta demonstrates that epidemic diseases, which took an enormous toll in early modern Europe, were much less threatening in Japan during the same period. The two and one-half centuries of peace and stability known as the *Pax Tokugawa* (1600–1868) were also characterized by relatively low and stable mortality. Dr. Jannetta finds no evidence that bubonic plague, which periodically devastated Europe from the fourteenth to the seventeenth centuries, was epidemic in Japan.
