The first definitive bio-bibliographical study of Nicolas Bautista Monardes, of which possibly the most valuable feature is the extensive and detailed bibliography comprising 50 title-entries. These include full notes, descriptions, references and locations of copies; an index of documentary references; and other supplementary material.

Monardes was the most widely read Spanish physician in 16th-century Europe. His work was translated during the century into Latin, English, Italian, French, German, and Dutch, and thanks to his writings America's contribution to medical lore began. In his books he recognizably describes tobacco, balsam, coca, jalap, and many other American plants. Apart from this he published treatises on pharmacology, toxicology, and medicine, also monographs about therapeutical materials, phlebotomy, and the qualities of iron and snow, all of which can be read with advantage even today. One can say that after his time no history of medicine was written in which traces of his work could not be found.

A Study in the Voluntary Hospital System

This book, the first volume of a two volume work, is not 'just another history of a hospital'. Rather it is the early exciting life of one, told in the entertaining style of the day against the medical, social and political history of that period.

The story begins in a public house. It continues in dirty houses near the Tower. It culminates in the building and consolidation of the great hospital in Whitechapel. Contrasts of humour and tragedy, of refinement and vulgarity, of cruelty and kindness, all so characteristic of 18th-century life, crowd its pages. Conflicts of personalities and of pressure groups, all so important in determining events, add drama to the tale. This also tells how the Napoleonic Wars nearly killed the hospital.

This is a good bedside book for anybody. Every page teems with humour or tragedy or provides something of social and medical interest. It will also be of interest to historians. For it describes the origin of the hospital movement with the awakening of the social conscience in the early 18th century and carries it up to the beginning of the Victorian era.
