THE SOCIETY

The American Society of Law, Medicine & Ethics (ASLME) is an interdisciplinary educational association whose mission is to provide high-quality debate, scholarship, and critical thought for the community of professionals at the intersection of law, health care, policy, and ethics.

PUBLICATIONS

Membership in ASLME includes annual subscriptions to two quarterly publications: *The Journal of Law, Medicine & Ethics* (formerly *Law, Medicine & Health Care*) and the *American Journal of Law & Medicine*.

The Journal of Law, Medicine & Ethics is a professional quarterly read by more than 6,500 doctors, lawyers, nurses, ethicists, hospital administrators, allied health professionals, and students. *JLME* provides well-written and often controversial articles on such timely topics as health care standards and access, managed care, ethics committees, consent, assisted dying, genetic technology, reproductive freedom, and public health concerns. Each issue also features reviews of significant policy decisions, books, and recent health law developments.

The Spring 1995 issue of the journal features a symposium pediatric decision making, guest edited by Cindy Hylton Rushton and Jacqueline Glover, and a symposium on clinical practice guidelines, guest edited by Alexander Capron and Christine Cassel.

The *American Journal of Law & Medicine* is a law review co-published with the Boston University School of Law. *AJLM* was founded to fulfill the need for a scholarly journal dedicated to improving communication among legal and medical professionals. Each issue contains in-depth articles and case notes—on broad themes relating to health law and policy, and legal, ethical, and economic aspects of medical practice, research, and education—and selected book reviews and health law court decisions.

The Winter 1994 issue of the journal featured a symposium on teaching health law, guest edited George Annas, in honor of the late Joseph Healey.

In conjunction with several publishing houses, the Society has published several books. Each includes edited and annotated versions of papers presented at ASLME conferences, as well as seminal articles on specific topics. Books include: *Implementing the Americans with Disabilities Act*; *AIDS and the Health Care System*; *Surrogate Motherhood: Politics and Privacy*; and *Human Organ Transplantation*.

CONFERENCES

A principal activity of the Society is sponsorship of continuing education conferences. Members receive advance notification of all conferences and are provided with the opportunity to register at reduced rates. Students are encouraged to attend and are also given price reductions.

Future and past conference topics include managed care, medical liability, end-of-life decision making, prescription drug abuse, health care reform, TB and AIDS, ethics committees, as well as a series of successful international conferences. Each conference includes panel debates, roundtable discussions, and educational workshops. Society conferences are accredited for legal, medical, and nursing credit, with other credit arranged as appropriate to the topic.

OTHER SERVICES

The *Sagall Library of Law, Medicine & Health Care* is located at the Society's headquarters in the Boston University School of Law. The library contains a comprehensive collection of medicolegal reference texts and monographs, periodicals, judicial opinions, pamphlets, and reprints. On-site materials are supplemented by the Boston University School of Law library.

The *Speakers' Bureau* provides a means by which authorities in the health care may be contacted by organizations seeking qualified speakers. Members interested in speaking on specific issues are encouraged to provide bibliographic information, which is kept on file and distributed to interested organizations.

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The editors encourage the submission of manuscripts on a wide range of medicolegal topics for publication in the JOURNAL. Acceptable subjects include health law and policy; legal, ethical, social, and economic aspects of medical practice, education, and research; health-related insurance; and other important or interesting subjects involving the relationship of the life sciences to the social sciences and humanities. The JOURNAL is interdisciplinary. Contributions from specialists in a variety of disciplines are welcomed.

GENERAL FORM: Manuscripts must be in typed form and single-sided. They must be double-spaced, with liberal margins. Manuscripts should be submitted in *triplicate*, i.e., an original and two photocopies. The title of the paper and the author's name and address should be given only on the covering sheet. Papers should exceed forty pages in length. If a paper is accepted, the author will be expected to provide a diskette copy of the manuscript either in MS Word 2.0 or WordPerfect 5.1 or 6.0.

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PROOF PAGES AND AUTHOR REPRINTS: Authors will be given *one* set of proof pages prior to publication. Proof pages will incorporate textual revisions discussed between the assigned editor and the author. Reprint order forms will accompany the proof pages. All orders must be prepaid.

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
