Notes (from R. James Long and J. W. Goering)

*These two works are known only through Leland. not the most reliable source. RJL has found no internal references in the Sentence Commentary to either of these works.

**known only from a remark in an anonymous pastoral work written towards the end of the thirteenth century.

JWG and RJL argued that it is not the work suggested by Boyle in a Corpus Christi MS (see *Bulletin de Philosophie Médiévale* 31(1989) 103–111). JWG thinks that the author was Richard of Wetheringsett, and the work was written in about 1220. JWG supposes that there is a treatise by Fishacre, *De spe, fide et caritate*, but that it has not yet been identified.

Bologna: Biblioteca Univ. 1546 (xiii) I–III: belonged to S. Domenico, Bologna.

Cambridge: Gonville+Caues College 329/4 It (xiii) 1–IV: probably original College holdings.

Chicago: University 156 Promptuarium Homileticum (xiv): provenance'?

Liverpool: University F.4.18 (xiii ex) IV (imperfect): provenance?

London: British Library Royal 10.B.vii (xiii) I–IV: in S. Mary Overy, Southwark in 15th C.

London: Lambeth Palace 116 (xiv) prologues only: S. Augustine's Abbey, Canterbury.

Napoli: Biblioteca Nazionale VII.C. 19 (xiii?) IV: in Augustinian priory at Carbonara by 1552

Oxford: Balliol College 57 (xiii) 1–IV: given to Balliol by Archbishop Grey late 15th C.

Oxford: New College E 112 (xiii) I–II: given by Archbishop Cranley + 1417

Oxford: Oriel College 31 (xiii ex) Indexes only: given to Oriel by Thomas Gascoigne in 15th C.

- Oxford: Oriel College 43 I-IV: given to Oriel College by Master John Martill in 1430
- Paris Bibliothèque Nationale lat. 15754 (xiii) I–III: given to the Sorbonne, 1265 by Gerard of Abbeville.
- Paris Bibliothèque Nationale lat. 16389 (xiii) I–II d.3: in the Sorbonne by 1338
- Rome Biblioteca Vaticana Ottob. lat.294 (xiii) 1-IV d.8. owned by Italian OPs then by 1490 owned by Marco Barbo, Patriarch of Aquilgien.
- Vienna Nat. Bibl. 1514 (xiv) I–II: English manuscript, given by Master Stephen Enczesdorff to Collegio Ducalis in Vienna early 15th C

- Cambridge Trinity College O.1.30 / 1054, *Divisio Scientiarum*, extracts from Fishacre's Commentary: Fountains Abbey.
- Cambridge Trinity College B. 15.38 / 373. Sermons, one at least by Fishacre: provenance?

- Oxford: Bodleian Library MS Laud Misc 511 fols.96va–99va has one sermon by Richard Fishacre.

NB. possibly the Chicago and Naples manuscripts should be in this category as they seem to have extracts from Fishacre's *Commentary* rather than its continuous text.
