Departure, 2nd October 1989. £1750.

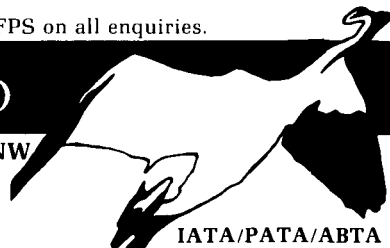
