AMENDMENT OF RULES 102-105

PASSED AT THE SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING OF 4TH JULY, 1922

Lord Chalmers, President, in the chair.

Rule 102 as follows :—

Societies established *in Asia* for the same objects for which the Society was formed, may, on the recommendation of the Council, be admitted by a vote of a Special General Meeting to be Branch Societies of the Royal Asiatic Society.

Amended wording.

Societies established for the same objects for which the Society was formed, may, on the recommendation of the Council, be admitted by a vote of a Special General Meeting to be Branch Societies of the Royal Asiatic Society.

Rule 103 as follows :—

Societies established *in parts of the world other than Asia*, for the same objects for which the Society was formed, may, on the recommendation of the Council, be admitted by vote of a Special General Meeting to be Associate Societies of the Royal Asiatic Society.

Amended wording.

Societies established for the same objects for which the Society was formed, may, on the recommendation of the Council, be admitted by vote of a Special General Meeting to be Associate Societies of the Royal Asiatic Society.

Rule 104 to be deleted.

Rule 105 as follows :—

Members of the Asiatic Society of Bengal and of Branch and Associate Societies are entitled while on furlough or

otherwise temporarily resident within the limits of Great Britain and Ireland to the use of the Library as non-resident Members, and to attend the Meetings of the Society other than Special General Meetings ; and in the case of any Member of *any Society aforesaid* applying for election as a Member of the Royal Asiatic Society, nomination as laid down in Rule 4 shall not be necessary.

Amended wording.

Members of the Asiatic Society of Bengal and of Branch and Associate Societies are entitled while on furlough or otherwise temporarily resident within the limits of Great Britain and Ireland to the use of the Library as Non-resident Members, and to attend the Meetings of the Society other than Special General Meetings ; and in the case of any Member of the *Asiatic Society of Bengal or of any Branch Society aforesaid* applying for election as a Member of the Royal Asiatic Society, nomination as laid down in Rule 4 shall not be necessary.
