

ALICE MEYNELL CENTENARY TRIBUTE. Edited by Terence L. Connolly, S.J. (Bruce Humphries, Boston, U.S.A.; \$2.25.)

This small but well produced volume is the record of a Symposium held last year at Boston College to mark the hundredth anniversary of the birth of Alice Meynell. It opens with a personal tribute from Mr R. F. Wilberforce, who first met Mrs Meynell in Rome, when he was attached to the British Legation to the Holy See. There follow appreciations of her prose by Miss A. K. Tuell and of her poetry by Sister Mary Madeleva, both well qualified by knowledge and love to write on their respective subjects. Finally the Editor contributes some notes on the complete collection of Alice Meynell's works in the Boston College library, of which he is the librarian. These works, numbering nearly one hundred and fifty in all, are listed in an appendix, which reveals something of the range and versatility of Alice Meynell's mind, and which will be useful to those desirous of reading her less widely known writings.
