To our great regret this volume, planned as a jubilee number in honour of the eightieth birthday of the President of the Institute, has now to be published as a tribute to his memory. Contributors and readers will, however, be glad to know that, owing to the close relations existing between the President and the Editor, the President was able to see and read all the contributions either in manuscript or in proof, and was deriving the utmost pleasure from them. He intended to write personal letters of thanks to each contributor as soon as the volume appeared. He was determined also, despite increasing infirmity, to accept the invitation he had received to take part in a cruise to Greece and Southern Turkey as Guest of Honour. He was not destined to complete the voyage ; but he was able, only two days before his death at Beirut on 12th September, to accomplish his dearest wish, to revisit the scene of his last excavations at Yümük Tepe, Mersin, where he and his old friend, Mr. G. M. FitzGerald, gave the assembled passengers a brief account of the site and its significance for archaeology.

All the articles and messages (with the exception of the messages from Professor Fairman and Sir Leonard Woolley) were written during the President's lifetime, and as they were already in page proof at the time of his death, it was thought best to leave them unchanged. That the wishes and hopes expressed in them were not all fulfilled will be deeply regretted by his many friends, but they may be assured that these good wishes contributed greatly to Professor Garstang's happiness during the last few months of his life. It may also be of interest to them to know that just before his departure on the cruise he was able to put the last touches to his long-awaited work on Hittite geography.
