

## EDITOR'S NOTES

A new scholarly journal, *Labor History*, has been announced for publication in late 1959 or 1960. Richard B. Morris is chairman of the editorial board. Manuscripts should be address to Dr. Norman Jacobs, editorial director, Care of The Tamiment Institute, 7 East 15th Street, New York 3, New York.

The first issue of *Business History* (F. E. Hyde editor, Liverpool University Press) was published in December, 1958. Issued biannually the new journal has a subscription rate of 30/ or \$5. The first number contains an introduction by T. S. Ashton, four articles, and six book reviews. Although a variety of topics is covered, this issue will be of particular value to those interested in the history of the iron industry of Great Britain.

Three one thousand dollar prizes are to be awarded annually by the American Academy of Arts and Sciences for unpublished monographs, one each in the following fields; humanities, social sciences, and physical and biological sciences. Monographs are defined as "scholarly contributions to knowledge, too long for an article in a learned journal and too specialized for a general book." At a meeting of the trustees held on February 22 of this year, Arthur H. Cole resigned as chairman of the Committee on Research in Economic History.
