BEHAVIORAL ASSESSMENT

Behavioral Assessment is a new interdisciplinary journal publishing original contributions in the area of behavioral assessment. Behavioral assessment is broadly conceived to include assessment, design, methodology, statistics, dependent variables, and program evaluations, regardless of population of setting.

The contents of *Behavioral Assessment* will include: investigations of behavioral assessment procedures or devices; evaluation of dependent variables for applied and/or research settings; assessment issues in clinical, institutional, medical, community, organizational, and educational settings; discussions or examples of methodology, design, and statistics; systematic program evaluations of behavioral intervention strategies; innovative assessment strategies; theory of behavioral assessment; normative data on response occurrence and covariation; evaluation of alternative means of assessing specific problem behaviors; descriptions of and data supporting the utility of mechanical assessment aids; and case studies with innovative dependent variables.
