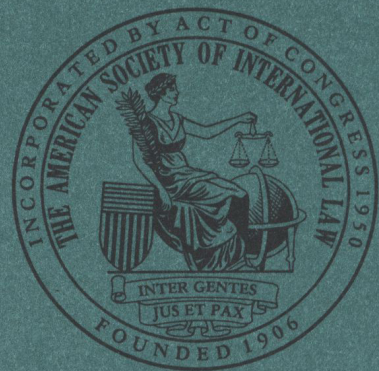

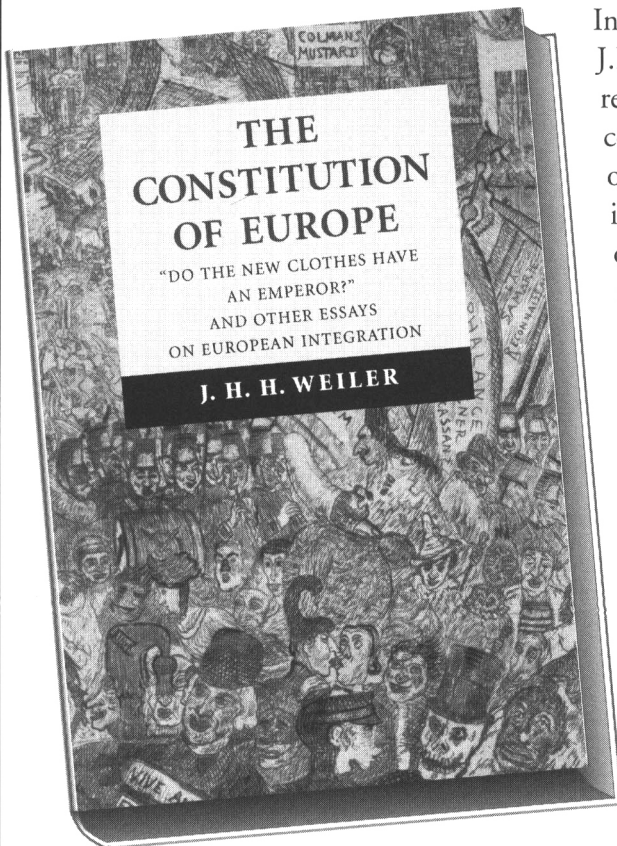

# The Constitution of Europe

"Do the New Clothes Have an Emperor?" and Other Essays  
on European Integration

**Joseph Weiler**



In *The Constitution of Europe* J.H.H. Weiler presents a revised and supplemented collection of essays written over the last ten years on issues related to the politics of the law of European integration. The book includes his widely discussed essay, *The transformation of Europe*, with a new afterword, as well as his 1997 London School of Economics Jean Monnet Lecture, *To be a European citizen: Eros and civilization*. The book is bound to provoke Europhiles and Euroskeptics alike. Weiler deals critically with both the ends and the means of

European integration. Although individuals as well as legal consumers have been hugely empowered by Community law, he writes, there has been a corresponding disempowerment in their status as citizens. And despite its notable success in attaining its historical objectives of consolidating post-war peace and contributing to a new-found European prosperity, today's Union, bereft of its original transcendent ideals, risks becoming the perfect incarnation of bread-and-circus *fin-de-siècle* politics.

<b>"Constitutionalization" and Dispute Settlement in the WTO: National Security as an Issue of Competence</b> <i>Hannes L. Schloemann and Stefan Ohlhoff</i>	424
The constitutionalization of the WTO is forcing a reappraisal of certain states' claims based on national security. The authors examine the claim raised in the U.S.-EC Helms-Burton dispute that the very invocation of the GATT's security exception bars WTO review. They conclude that the sovereign prerogative of the state to define its essential security interests does not exclude the WTO's interpretive and adjudicatory competence. A clear separation of spheres allows for a constitutional solution within the system.
