7. The Annual Subscription is Forty Shillings, post free, and is payable in advance.

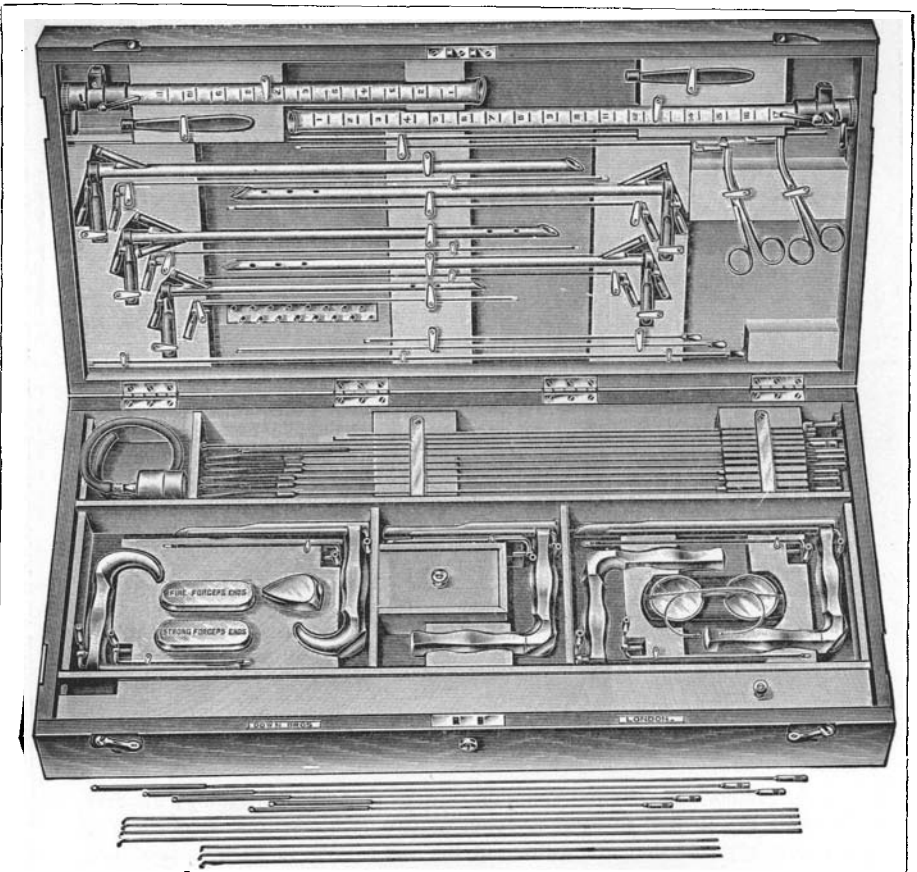
8. Single copies of back numbers, both of the present and the previous series, are on sale at Four Shillings each.

Major operations are performed daily, except Mondays, in the In-patient Operating Theatres. Minor operations are performed in the Out-patient Department by the Assistant Surgeons on four mornings a week.
