
The History of Ophthalmoiogy by Professor Julius Hirschberg is well known all over the world. However, as it was up to now only available in German it was not as widely used and quoted as it should have been.


Dr. Blodi translated not only the German text, but also all quotations which in the German edition are printed in the language of the original source, most of them in Greek, Latin, French and Italian

Professor Hirschberg is the only author who was capable of reading all the source material in the original language. He traveled around the world and found many original manuscripts for the first time. He was supported by numerous friends and colleagues. He wrote this history over a period of nearly 20 years between 1889 and 1918.

This monumental history will now be available in English. Volume 1 and 2 are now available. The first volume contains the history of ophthalmology in antiquity and consists of 260 chapters. It deals with:

- a. Ophthalmology in Ancient Egypt
- b. Ophthalmology in Assyria and Babylonia
- c. Ophthalmology in Israel
- d. Ophthalmology in Persia
- e. Ophthalmology in India
- f. Ophthalmology in Ancient Greece
  - 1. Optics in Ancient Greece
  - 2. The Anatomy of the Eve in Ancient Greece
- g. Ocular Medications in Antiquity
- h. The Clinical Ophthalmology of the Successors to the Alexandrian School
- i. Galenus
- j. The Late Hellenistic and Byzantine Collections, Textbooks and Excerpts
- k. The Greek Dogmas of Ophthalmology

All these chapters are subdivided into parts that deal with therapy, anatomy, physiology, etc. The Table of Contens of the first volume alone extends over eight pages (not including an index).

Volume II deals with the history of ophthalmology in Arabia and in Europe during the Middle Ages (with a history of spectacles.

Volumes III containing ophthalmology of modern times, the 16th and 17th centuries and the Renaissance of ophthalmology in the 18th century will appear in 1984.

It is planned to publish the following volumes in rapid sequence, usually two to three volumes per year.


These books will be printed on high quality art print paper. They will be elegantly bound with gold impregnation.

The greater part of the book concerns those current 'perceptions' of madness, which, although hardly elaborated with scientific rigour, marked off the terrain on which medical psychology advanced and informed the practices which were established in the new lunatic asylums.
