Ecological and Transformational Politics

Jervis and Paul W. Schroeder International History and Politics Book Prize. To be awarded for the first time in 2001, the prize will go to the best single authored, multiauthored, or edited book published in a two-year period which promotes, explains, and/or employs (a) history and historiographical methods to improve the analysis and understanding of international politics; and/or (b) political science and scientific methods to improve the analysis and understanding of international history. At their respective meetings during APSA's 2000 Annual Meeting in

Washington, DC, Organized Sections presented over 50 awards recognizing dissertations, books, papers, and careers. Federalism and Intergovernmental Relations

The Distinguished Scholar Award, recognizing distinguished scholarly contributions to the study of federalism and intergovernmental relations, was presented to **Thomas Anton**, a member of the departments of political science and public policy at Brown University. The Best Paper Award, conferred for the best paper in the field of federalism and intergovernmental relations presented at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting, went to **Alexandra Filindra** of Rutgers University, New Brunswick for her paper, "Fiscal Federalism and the Politics of Intergovernmental Grants: Lessons for the European Union." The Best Book Award, given for the best book on federalism and intergovernmental relations published at least 10 years ago that has made a lasting contribution to the study of federalism and intergovernmental relations, was presented to **David B. Walker** of the University of Connecticut for *Toward a Functioning Federalism* (Winthrop, 1981).

Law and Courts

Members of the law and courts section saw the American Judicature Society Award for the best paper on law and courts presented at the previous year's annual meetings of the American, Midwest, Northeastern, Southern, Southwestern, or Western Political Science Associations conferred upon **Laura Langer** of the University of Arizona for "Does the Chief Justice on State Courts of Last Resort Shape Judicial Review? The Case of Workers' Compensation." Langer gave the paper at the APSA meeting. **Robert A. Dahl** of

Yale University received the Harcourt College Publishers Award for his article, "Decision Making in a Democracy: The Supreme Court as a National Policy Maker" (*Journal of Public Law* 6: 279-95 [1958]). The award is given for a book or journal article 10 years or older that has made a lasting impression on the field of law and courts. The Congressional Quarterly Press Award, conferred for the best graduate student paper presented during 1999, was given to **Michael Ebeid** of Yale University for "Do Presidents Shape Supreme Court Ideology? An Analysis of Judicial Agreement Tendencies." **Harold J. Spaeth** of Michigan State University and **Jeffrey A. Segal** of the University of Kansas were awarded the C. Herman Pritchett Award for *Majority Rule or Minority Will: Adherence to Precedent on the U.S. Supreme Court* (Cambridge University Press, 1999). The Pritchett Award was given for the best book on law and courts written by a political scientist and published in 1999. Honorable Mention was given to **Judith A. Baer** of Texas A&M University for *Our Lives Before the Law: Constructing a Feminist Jurisprudence* (Princeton University Press, 1999). Lastly, the Lifetime Achievement Award honoring a distinguished career of achievement and service in the field of law and courts was given to **Beverly Blair Cook**, who is professor emeritus at University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee.

Legislative Studies

At the Legislative Studies business meeting, the section presented a number of prizes. The CQ Press Award for the best paper on legislative studies presented at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting went to **David Brady, Kara Buckley, and Doug Rivers** of Stanford University for their paper, "Strong Parties Revisited, 1870-1930." The Carl Albert Dissertation Award for the best doctoral dissertation in the area of legislative studies (1997-98) was given to **Glen S. Krutz** of Arizona State University for "Explaining Institutional Change: The Rise and Impact of Omnibus Legislating." And **David Canon** of the University of Wisconsin

Priorities of NEH Questioned by Scholars

Since surviving a threat of elimination in 1996, the National Endowment for the Humanities has struggled to meet scholar's demands for support of academic projects and Congress' demands for developing popular programs. Of special concern to historians and linguists is the Endowment's decreasing support for long-term projects, like editing the papers of Susan B. Anthony and compiling a Sumerian dictionary, and increasing support for strictly popular projects like a photography exhibit titled "Barn Again."

Agency director William Ferris has defended the reallocation of funds as necessary to ensure the NEH's survival. He has also said that winning Congressional support for any NEH-sponsored projects would help increase funds for all projects. His argument was partially borne out this year when Congress approved a \$5 million increase in the FY01 Endowment budget, the first significant increase in five years. Still, many questions whether NEH is meeting the needs of its core constituency.

A draft of a policy statement on supporting long-term projects has been posted for comment at www.neh.gov/news/editionssupport.html. Currently, NEH funds 62 long-term projects.

Females Match or Exceed Males in Educational Attainment

A recent national survey of educational attainment revealed that females have caught up with or surpassed males in nearly all categories. Female students consistently outperform their male peers in reading and writing, young men and women take equally challenging math and science courses in high school, and females are more likely than males to both enroll in and complete college. Majority of Graduate Students Part Time

As reported in *Lifelong Learning Trends*, just over half of all U.S. graduate students attended school part time during the 1995-96 school year and a large majority of all individuals seeking graduate degrees were enrolled in master's or first professional programs. The University Continuing Education Association, which compiled the report, also found that 57% of master's degree recipients in 1997 were women. Too Many Ph.D.s?

In *Addressing the Nation's Changing Needs for Biomedical and Behavioral Scientists*, a committee of the National Research Council recommended that "there should be no growth in the aggregate number of Ph.D.s awarded in the behavioral and social sciences." In light of the current and projects needs, the committee concluded that "the present number of approximately 2600 new behavioral and social science Ph.D.s a year is sufficient . . . until at least 2005."

Women Hold Increasing Share of Faculty Positions while Minorities' Shares Hold Steady

In 1997, women held 41% of the 989,813 faculty positions available at the 4093 U.S. colleges and universities that participated in federal student loan programs. This share is up from 27% in 1976. The news is only slightly encouraging, though, because women are overrepresented among the ranks of part-time faculty. Also less than encouraging for champions of diversity, blacks held only 5% of faculty positions, while Latinos held 2.6%, Asians 3%, and Native Americans 0.2%. Follow Ups

- A bill Senator Daniel Moynihan (D-NY) introduced in 1999 in the hopes of transforming the federal government's information classification system was attached to a much-modified version as a rider to the FY2001 Intelligence Authorization Act. The Public Interest Declassification Act (S. 1801) calls for creation of nine-member board charged with promoting openness, supporting congressional oversight of declassification, and making recommendations to the president on classification policies and practices.
- Rep. Dan Miller (R-FL), chair of the House Subcommittee on the Census, has introduced legislation that would establish a 10-year fixed term for the director of the U.S. Census Bureau. According to Miller the bill would help remove partisan politics from the census and "allow one director to supervise an entire census from planning to implementation."

The Aaron Wildavsky Enduring Contribution Award, given for a book or article published in the last 10 to 20 years that continues to influence the study of public policy, was bestowed upon **Elinor Ostrom** of Indiana University for *Governing the Commons: The Evolution of Institutions for Collective Action* (Cambridge University Press, 1990).

Political Organizations and Parties

The Samuel Eldersveld Career Achievement Lifetime Award, honoring a scholar whose lifetime of professional work has made an outstanding contribution to the field, was conferred upon **Kenneth Janda** of Northwestern University. The Emerging Scholar Award, awarded to a young scholar in the field of political organizations and parties, was given to **Kevin Hula** of Loyola University. And the Jack Walker Outstanding Article Award, honoring an article or published paper of unusual significance and importance to the field, was bestowed upon **Pradeep Chhibber** and **Ken Kollman** of University of Michigan for "Party Aggregation and the Number of Parties in India and the United States" (*APSR* 92[June]: 329-42 [1998]).

Public Administration

Jeffrey L. Brudney of the University of Georgia, **Deil Wright** of the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and **F. Ted Hebert** of the University of Utah were presented with the 1999 Herbert Kaufman Award for the best paper presented at the preceding year's APSA Annual Meeting. Their paper was titled "From Organizational Values

to Organizational Roles: Examining Representative Bureaucracy in State Administration."

Conflict Processes

The Conflict Processes Book Award for a book of significance in the field of conflict processes was awarded to **Robert Powell** of the University of California, Berkeley for his work, *In the Shadow of Power* (Princeton University Press, 1999).

Representation and Electoral Systems

The George H. Hallett Award, presented annually to the author of a book published at least 10 years ago that has made a lasting contribution to the literature on representation and electoral systems, was bestowed upon **G. Bingham Powell** of the University of Rochester for *Contemporary Democracies: Participation, Stability, and Violence* (Harvard University Press, 1982). The Leon Weaver Award given for the best paper presented at a panel sponsored by the Representation and Electoral Systems Division was given to **Stephen D. Ansolabehere**, **James M. Snyder**, and **Jonathan Woon**, all of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, for "The Undemocratic Democracy, or Why the People of California Voted to Disenfranchise Themselves."

Presidency Research

The Richard E. Neustadt Award, given for the best book published during the previous year that contributed to research and scholarship in the field of American presidency studies, was given to **David Alistair Yalof** of the University of Connecticut for his book, *Pursuit of Justice: Presidential Politics and the Selection of Supreme Court Nominees* (University of Chicago Press, 1999). The Founder's Award honoring Martha Joynt Kumar, awarded for the best paper on the U.S. presidency presented at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting, was bestowed upon **Keith Wittington** of Princeton University and **Daniel Carpenter** of the University of Michigan for "Institutional Development in a System of Separation of Powers." Lastly, The Founder's Award honoring David Naveh, awarded for the best paper

presented by a graduate student at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting, was awarded to **Kevin S. Price** of the University of Wisconsin, Madison for "The Partisan Legacies of Preemptive Leadership: Assessing the Eisenhower Cohorts in the U.S. House."

Religion and Politics

Peter Anders Von Doepp of Pepperdine University received the Aaron Wildavsky Award for the best dissertation on religion and politics. His dissertation was titled "Presbyterians, Catholics, and Grassroots Politics: Local Churches in Malawi's Post-Authoritarian Era." The Best Paper Award, for the best paper dealing with religion and politics presented at the 1999 APSA Meeting, was conferred upon **Anthony Gill** of the University of Washington for "Religion and Political Attitudes in Latin America: Evidence from the World Values Survey."

Urban Politics

The Best Book Award for the best book on urban politics published in 1999 was given to **Jeffrey R. Henig** of George Washington University, **Richard C. Hula** of Michigan State University, **Desiree S. Pedescleaux** of Spelman College, and **Marion Orr** of Brown University for *The Color of School Reform: Race, Politics, and the Challenge of Urban Education* (Princeton University Press, 1999). The Best Dissertation Award for the best dissertation on urban politics was awarded to **Patrick D. Joyce** of Harvard University. Doctoral candidate **Joshua Behr** of the University of New Orleans was presented The Bryan Jackson Award, which is given to a graduate student studying racial and ethnic politics in an urban setting, for "An Explanation for the Presence of Minority-Opportunity Districts and the Election of Hispanics and Blacks to City Council within Single Member District Election Systems."

Science, Technology and Environmental Politics

The Lynton Keith Caldwell Prize for the best book on environmental

politics and policy published in the past three years was conferred upon **Thomas Homer-Dixon** of the University of Toronto for *Environment, Scarcity, and Violence* (Princeton University Press, 1999).

Women and Politics

Two scholars shared the Best Article Award for the best article published in the field of women and politics in 1999. **Margaret Moore** was recognized for "The Ethics of Care and Justice" (*Women and Politics* 20[April]: 1-16 [1999]), and **Elizabeth Wingrove** of the University of Michigan received the award for "Interpellating Sex" (*Signs* 24[June]: 869-95 [1999]). The Best Dissertation Prize for the best dissertation on women and politics went to **Mala Nani Ntun** of the New School for Social Research for "Private Lives, Public Policies: Divorce, Abortion, and Family Equality in Latin America."

Foundations of Political Theory

At the foundation section's business meeting, **Jennifer Hochschild** of Princeton University received the David Easton Award in recognition of writing a book that broadens the horizons of contemporary political science by engaging issues of philosophical significance in political life through any of a variety of approaches in the social sciences and humanities: *Facing up to the American Dream: Race, Class, and the Soul of the Nation* (Princeton University Press, 1995). The First Book Award, recognizing the best first book published in 1999 by a scholar in the early stages of his or her career in the area of political theory/philosophy, was given to **Alan Patten** of McGill University for his book, *Hegel's Idea of Freedom* (Oxford University Press, 1999).

Information Technology and Politics

The Best Instructional Software Award recognizes a work that enhances the teaching of political science through the use of technology. It was shared by **Michael Corbett** of

Iversen for *Contested Economic Institutions: The Politics of Macroeconomics and Wage Bargaining in Advanced Democracies* (Cambridge University Press, 1999), and Treisman for *After the Deluge: Regional Crises and Political Consolidation in Russia* (University of Michigan Press, 1999). The Sage Prize for the best comparative politics paper presented at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting was given to **Barbara Geddes**, University of California, Los Angeles, for "Authoritarian Breakdown: Empirical Test of a Game Theoretic Argument." **Daniel S. Treisman** of the University of California, Los Angeles was named runner up for that prize. The Gregory Luebbert Best Article Award for the best professional article in comparative politics was bestowed upon **Stathis Kalyvas** of New York University for "Wanton and Senseless? The

The Best Paper Award for the best paper on state politics given at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting was awarded to **Paul Brace**, **Kellie Butler**, **Kevin T. Arceneaux**, and **Martin Johnson** of Rice University for "Public Opinion in the American States." **Karl Klamer** of Texas A&M University received the Best Graduate Student Paper Award for the best paper on state politics given at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting by a graduate student for "Party Control of State Government and Policy Outcomes: Taking Institutional Context into Account."

Political Communication

The Doris Graber Outstanding Book Award for the best book published on political communication in the last 10 years was conferred upon **William Gamson** of Boston College for his book, *Talking Politics* (Cambridge University Press, 1992). The Murray Edelman Distinguished Career Award for lifetime contribution to the study of political communication was given to **Roderick Hart** of the University of Texas, Austin. The Paul Lazarsfeld Best Paper Award for the best paper on political communication presented at the previous year's APSA Annual Meeting went to **Milton Lodge**, **Charles Tabor**, and **Aron Chase Galonsky**, all of University at Stony Brook-SUNY, for "The Political Consequences of Motivated Reasoning: Partisan Bias in Information Processing."

Politics and History

The J. David Greenstone Book Prize for the best book in politics and history published in 1999 was presented to **Elizabeth Sanders** of Cornell University for *Roots of Reform: Farmers, Workers and the American State, 1877-1917* (University of Chicago Press). The Mary Parker Follett Prize for the best article on politics and history published in the previous year was awarded to co-recipients. **Eileen L. McDonagh** of Northeastern University won for "Race, Class, and Gender in the Progressive Era: Restructuring State and Society" (*Progressivism and the New Democracy*, Sidney M. Milkis and Jerome M. Mileur, eds. [University of Massachusetts Press, 1999]). **Erin Kelly** and **Frank Dobbin** of Princeton University also took the award for "Civil Rights Law at Work: Sex Discrimination and the Rise of Maternity Leave Policies" (*American Journal of Sociology* 105[September]: 455-92).

Political Economy

Robert Powell, University of California, Berkeley, was awarded the Best Book Award for the best book on political economy published during the past three calendar years for *In the Shadow of Power* (Princeton University Press, 1999). The Best Dissertation Award for the best dissertation in political economy completed in the last two calendar years was presented to **Soo Yeon Kim** of Princeton University for "Ties that Bind: The Role of Trade in International Conflict Processes, 1950-1992."

New Political Science

The Michael Harrington Book Award was presented to **John Ehrenberg**, Long Island University, for *Civil Society: The Critical History of an Idea* (New York University Press, 1999). The award is given for an outstanding book that demonstrates how scholarship can be used in the struggle for a better world. The Christian Bay Award for the best new political science paper presented at the 1999 Annual Meeting

of the American Political Science Association was conferred upon **Carl Swidorski** of The College of Saint Rose for "Political Science and the First Amendment: Ignoring Labor's Role in the Struggle for Freedom of Expression."

Political Psychology

The Best Book Award for the best book on political psychology published in 1998 was given **Diana Mutz**, Ohio State University, for *Impersonal Influence: How Perceptions of Mass Collectives Affect Political Attitudes* (Cambridge University Press, 1998). The Margaret M. Hermann Scholarship to the OSU-ISPP Summer Institute in Political Psychology was given to Lieutenant Superville of Nova Southeastern University (FL).

Undergraduate Education

Matthew Reed of DeVry Institute received the Best Paper Presentation Award for the best presentation on undergraduate education at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting for his paper, "Back to Square One: Reinventing Political Science as a Humanistic Pursuit with Career-Minded Students."

Elections, Public Opinion and Voting Behavior

The Warren E. Miller Prize, awarded every two or three years for

an outstanding career of intellectual accomplishment and service to the profession in the elections, public opinion, and voting behavior field, was conferred upon **Sidney Verba** of Harvard University. The Best Paper Award for the best paper delivered at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting was given to **Robert Huckfeldt** of Indiana University and **John Sprague** of Washington University for "Political Environments, Micro-environments, and the Dynamics of Political Preference." The Philip E. Converse Book Award for an outstanding book in the field published at least five years earlier was awarded to **John Zaller** of the University of California, Los Angeles for *The Nature and Origins of Mass Opinion* (Cambridge University Press, 1992). The Emerging Scholar Award, awarded to the top scholar in the field who is within 10 years of receiving his or her Ph.D., was given to **Christopher J. Anderson** of Binghamton University-SUNY.

Race, Ethnicity and Politics

The Best Paper Award, given for the best paper presented in a RE-sponsored panel at the 1999 APSA Annual Meeting, went to **Yasmeen Abu-Laban** of the University of Alberta for "Reconstructing an Inclusive Citizenship: Globalization, Migration and Difference." Three people were honored with the Best Dissertation Award. **Diane-Michele Prindeville** of the University of New

Mexico received the award for "On the Streets and in the State House: American Indian and Hispanic Women and Environmental Policy-making in New Mexico." **Lisa Garcia Bedolla** of Yale University won for "Fluid Borders: Latino Identity Community and Politics in Los Angeles." And **Kristen Hill-Maher** of the University of California, Irvine was recognized for "A Stranger in the House: American Ambivalence About Immigrant Labor." The Best Book Award for the best book on racial and ethnic politics published in 1999 was conferred upon **Victor Montejo** of the University of California, Davis for *Voices from Exile: Violence and Survival in Modern Maya History* (University of Oklahoma Press). The Best Book Award for the best book on race relations and public policy published in 1999 was awarded to **Cathy J. Cohen** of Yale University for *The Boundaries of Blackness: AIDS and the Breakdown of Black Politics* (University of Chicago Press). **Mary C. Waters** received the Best Book Award for the best book of 1999 on ethnic political incorporation for *Black Identities: West Indian Immigrant Dreams and American Realities* (Harvard University Press). Finally, the Best Book Award for the best book of 1999 on the social construction of race was given to **Robert G. Lee** of Marians Baptist Academy for *Oriental: Asian Americans in Popular Culture* (Temple University Press).
