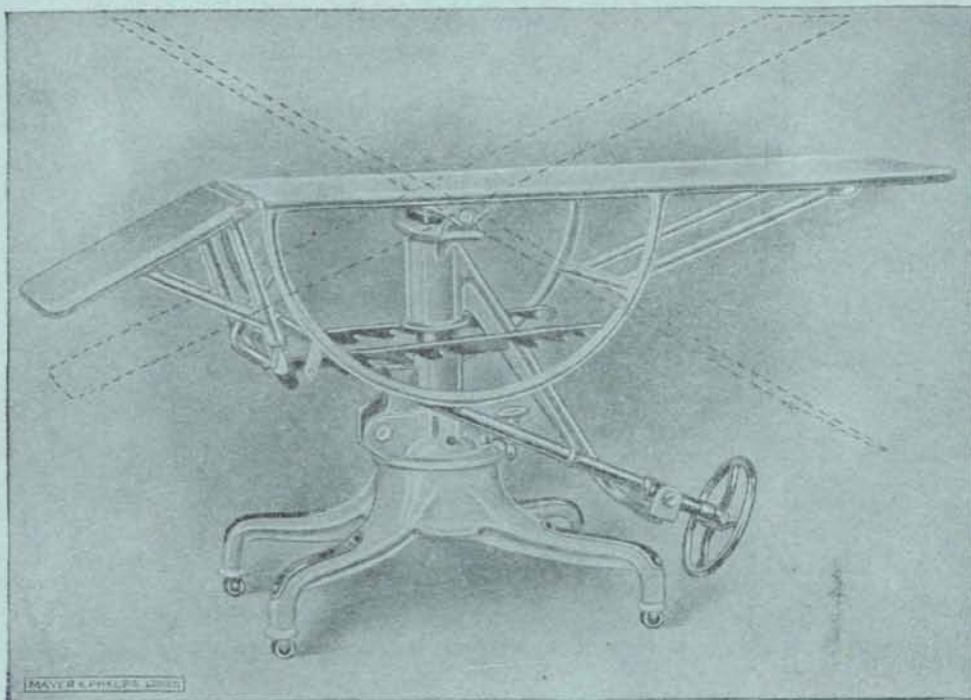
The Annual Meeting of the American Laryngological Association will be held at Atlantic City on 19th, 20th, and 21st May.

Peroral Endoscopy Table

This table is arranged for nasal and aural operations as well as for endoscopic work.

The back rest is adjustable from the dependant position shown in the illustration to one nearly at right angles to the top of the table for nasal operations, in which case a suitable head rest is attached.
