*Early Korea*, a new publication from the Early Korea Project at the Korea Institute, Harvard University, is a series designed to promote and develop studies of early Korean history and archaeology in the English language. While these fields are active and dynamic in East Asia, they are only beginning to develop in English-language scholarship. *Early Korea* provides a forum for scholarly articles focused on studies of Korean history, archaeology and art history prior to the tenth century. Each volume features a section dedicated to several articles focused on a selected theme, along with articles on timely issues in the fields of early Korean history and archaeology as well as studies on the academic fields themselves.

The first volume, "Reconsidering Early Korean History Through Archaeology," features three articles by prominent Korean scholars focused on the topic of recent advances in historical archaeology on the Korean peninsula and adjacent regions and how this is changing the ways historians understand the origins and development of the earliest states on the peninsula. Other articles include a survey of the development of Korean ceramic traditions and two studies on the practice of heritage management in Korea.

- Article manuscripts, including notes and references, should range between 8,000 and 10,000 words, or approximately thirty-five pages in length, and must include a 150 word abstract at the beginning of the document.
- Authors' names must be left off of the manuscript, as JAS engages in double-blind reviews.
- Manuscripts must be double-spaced with 12-point type and 1 inch margins including extracts, notes, and references, and formatted for letter-size (8.5 × 11 in.) paper if possible.
- Notes should be as few as possible and appear at the end of the text.
- Use parenthetical in-text citation, and author-date formatting for references per *Chicago Manual of Style*, 15th edition (Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 2003), pp. 616–24.
- Please use the following Romanization: Chinese: Pinyin; Japanese: Hepburn; Korean: McCune-Reischauer.
- Paper manuscript submissions are acceptable if electronic submission is not possible. Please include four copies of your document in the submission packet.
- Manuscripts submitted to JAS should not have been published elsewhere and should not be under review for publication elsewhere.
