The Ethical Union was founded in 1896, and became incorporated in 1928.

Its chief object is:—

“To promote by all lawful means the study of ethical principles; to advocate a religion of human fellowship and service, based on the principle that the supreme aim of religion is the love of goodness, and that moral ideas and the moral life are independent of beliefs as to the ultimate nature of things and a life after death; and, by purely human and natural means, to help men to love, know, and to do the right in all relations of life.”

The central business of the Union is conducted by a Council composed of Registered Members appointed at the Annual General Meeting or Congress of the Union and of Nominated Members from local Ethical Societies affiliated to the Union.
