The secrets of simple folk long dead in the wild misty islands of the Highlands have been enshrined for centuries in the Gaelic, known only to those who could master it. Now for the first time a volume of songs and prayers, of hymns, incantations, charms, and invocations has been translated into English verse and tells the hidden longings, fears, and hopes of a rugged simple people who varied between religion and superstition, the harsh realities of life and the high truths of the spirit.

The book is the child of ten years of devoted work by the translator, and contains 535 songs or recitations which cover every side of man's life in the far north, assured of the nearness of God and the companionship of saints.

It is a book to pick and choose from, to go back to, and to relish in small quantities. But it repays all the devotion of its maker, and those who have even a part of their hearts in the Highlands will want to read it, to smile at its naivete, warm to its generous heartedness, learn from its folk lore, and pray with many of its prayers.

The book gives, with facsimiles, the MS fragments found in four of these caves, and in four others previously discovered: the documents are from a wide range of Biblical and non-Biblical books and include the famous 'copper scroll' which is here formally published and studied in detail.
