NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS:

Only manuscripts in English are accepted. Manuscripts should be submitted in triplicate to the editorial coordinator.

The text, including footnotes and bibliography, should be double spaced. In-text references should be denoted by parentheses, with commas separating the author, year and –if needed– page number. Multiple references should be separated by a semicolon. This reference format should be used in footnotes as well. Example: (Said, 1979, p. 122; Kağıtçıbaşı, 1986, pp. 490–492).

The full details of the references should be listed only at the end of the text in a separate section entitled REFERENCES. Sample formats:

BOOK: Said, Edward W. 1979. *Orientalism*. New York: Vintage Books.

JOURNAL: Kağıtçıbaşı, Çiğdem. 1986. "Status of Women in Turkey: Cross-Cultural Perspectives," *International Journal of Middle East Studies*, 18(4), November.
