THE EDINBURGH MATHEMATICAL SOCIETY is instituted for the promotion and extension of Mathematical Science—Pure and Applied.

It consists of Ordinary and Honorary Members.

Candidates for admission as Ordinary Members are proposed and seconded at one ordinary meeting of the Society, and balloted for at the next, a majority of at least two-thirds of the members present being necessary for election.

The Annual Subscription for ordinary membership is ten shillings. Any Ordinary Member may compound for his Annual Subscription by the payment of six guineas in one sum, subject to a reduction of one guinea after ten years' membership and a reduction of one guinea for each subsequent five years' membership of the Society.

The Committee of the Society may nominate as Honorary Members persons eminently distinguished in the Mathematical Sciences. The mode of election is, otherwise, the same as for Ordinary Members.

Each Member whose Subscription is not in arrears receives the *Proceedings* and the *Mathematical Notes* as published.

Members wishing to complete their sets of the *first* series of *Proceedings* can have back volumes—so far as these are in print—on application to the Hon.
