GRANTS TO ASSIST PUBLICATION

The Mediterranean Archaeological Trust, set up in 1959 for the promotion of the study of archaeology, invites applications for grants, made on a competitive basis, for expenses in 2016-17, in the preparation for final **publication** of material from archaeological **excavation or fieldwork** in the Mediterranean world, **excluding** subventions to publishers or publication of material not from a specific excavation, or in symposia. Within the terms of the Trust, priority may be given to publication of Bronze Age sites. Grants for any amount, however small, will be considered, provided they expedite **publication**. The grants do not normally exceed £ 2000.

Applicants should complete the application form (downloadable from the MAT web-site: <https://sites.google.com/site/medarchtrust/grants>), which should be sent no later than **31 January 2016** by **e-mail attachment**, to:

Please follow the instructions on the form, taking care to indicate the importance of the site, your qualifications, other sources of support, and the present or planned status and place of publication. Apply **in good time to** ensure that your case can be fully considered. The references (which are **essential**) should be sent directly by the referees **to the same e-mail address** and must meet the deadline of 31 January. Successful applicants will be informed in April 2016, when they will be asked to provide full bank details for payment. A report on the use of the grant must be submitted by Dec. 1, 2016. Failure to do so is likely to mean future grant applications from you will not be considered.
