In the 1970s and 1980s the countries of Latin America dealt with their similar debt problems in very different ways—ranging from militantly market-oriented approaches to massive state intervention in their economies—while their political systems headed toward either democracy or authoritarianism. Jeffrey Frieden analyzes the different patterns of national economic and political behavior that arose in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Mexico, and Venezuela. He argues that variations in official borrowing policies and responses to lending cut-offs imposed by foreign creditors are best explained not by international but by domestic factors, particularly lobbying by powerful interest groups.

Human Rights since the Assassination of Archbishop Romero

In 1980 Archbishop Oscar Arnulfo Romero, El Salvador's outspoken advocate for peace and social justice, was murdered. Ten years later, six Jesuit priests, who, like Romero, worked for peace in El Salvador, were gunned down in cold blood.
