Page 27, Paragraph 2, line 6: “felt was needed beyond this was” is “feel is needed beyond this is”

P. 38, para. 2, l. 2: Reference to Chart 1 added

P. 40, para. 1, l. 3: Karakorum is Qaraqorum

P. 40, para. 2, l. 3: “Mongolia” is “Mongolia as his political center”

P. 41–43, Table 3, column 5 heading: Three instances of P + F3luvial corrected to Pluvial

- P. 43, Table 4, columns 1–2 headings: “reign eras” is “Reign eras”; “year span” is “Year span.”
- P. 46, Table 5, column 1 heading: “Reign eras of an emperor” is “Reign eras of each emperor”
- P. 46, Table 5, line 1: 1368 is 1268
- P. 49, para. 1, l. 7–8: Sentences split to read, “The most severe droughts were in 1585–89 and 1614–19. The fields were so parched in 1615 that the *Ming shi* reported that the landscape looked burnt.”
- P. 50, para. 2, l. 15: “markets efficient” is “grain markets efficient”
- P. 50, para. 2, l. 16: “This is to assume” is “From this we can postulate”
- P. 51, para. 3, l. 1: Reference to Chart 3 after Table 1 reference
- P. 51, para. 3, l. 3: “In Zhejiang province” is “According to a Zhejiang prefectural gazetteer.”
- P. 52, para. 3, l. 4: 554 is 553
- P. 52, para. 4, l. 9: comma following “...vary”) removed
- P. 53, para. 2, l. 1: “displays the 554 reports of famine prices” is “displays the temporal distribution of the famine prices”
- P. 53, para. 3, l. 6: 139 is 136
- P. 53, para. 5, l. 7: disasters is disaster
- P. 55, para. 5, l. 3: “1597” is “1597, midway between these two sloughs,”
- P. 56, para. 2, l. 1: environmental is sustained
- P. 58, para. 3, l. 5–6: “makes a point of mentioning” is “similarly focuses on”
- P. 58, para. 3, l. 14–15: Sentence ending at outburst continues, “...outburst, yet attached to that was his recollection that the temperature had been cold that morning.”
