DR. GEORGE WEBBER PRIZE

The Friends of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in Great Britain have established a prize in honour of Dr. George Webber of the University of London.

The sum of IL.500 will be awarded annually for the best contribution accepted for publication in the ISRAEL LAW REVIEW or *MISHPATIM* (Students Law Review) from any student of the Hebrew University working towards the degree of LL.B. or LL.M.
