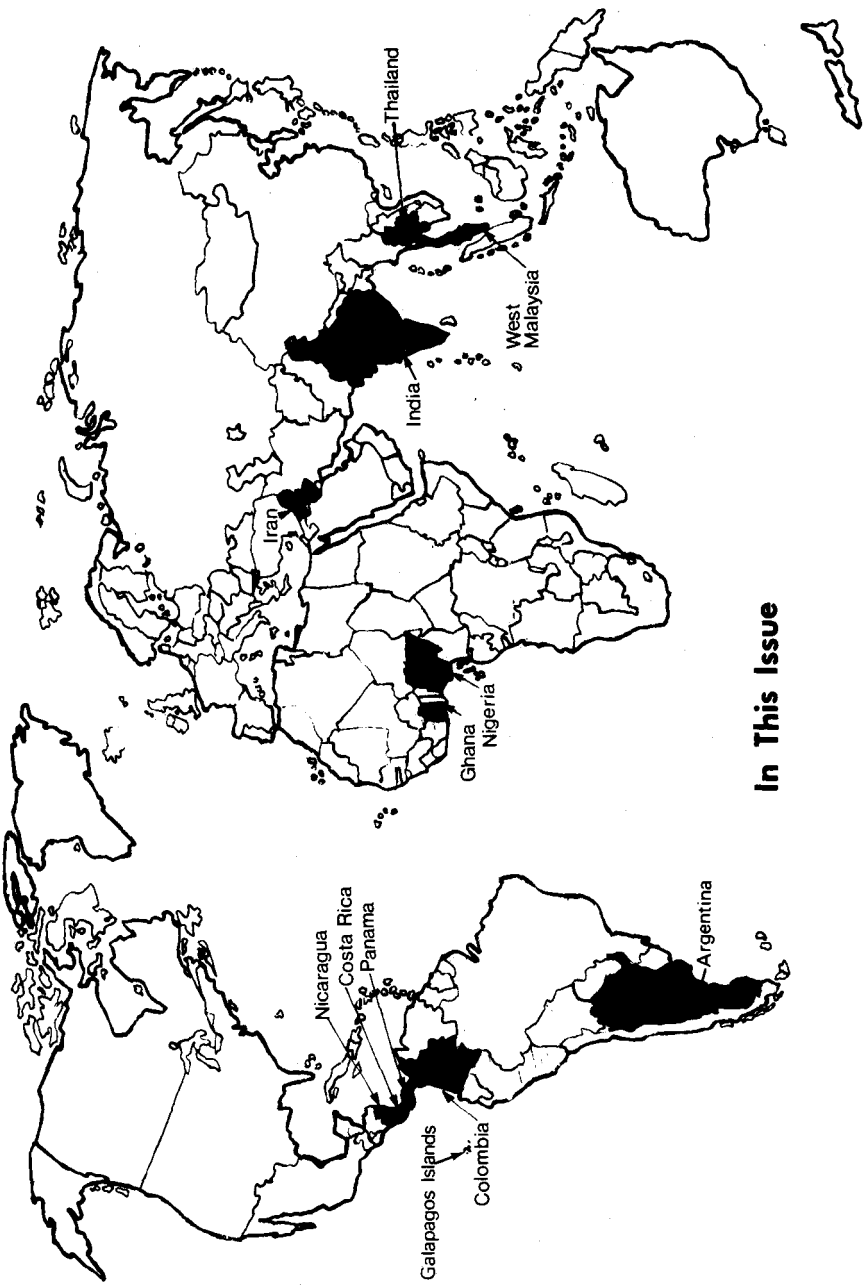
ORYX TOURS
