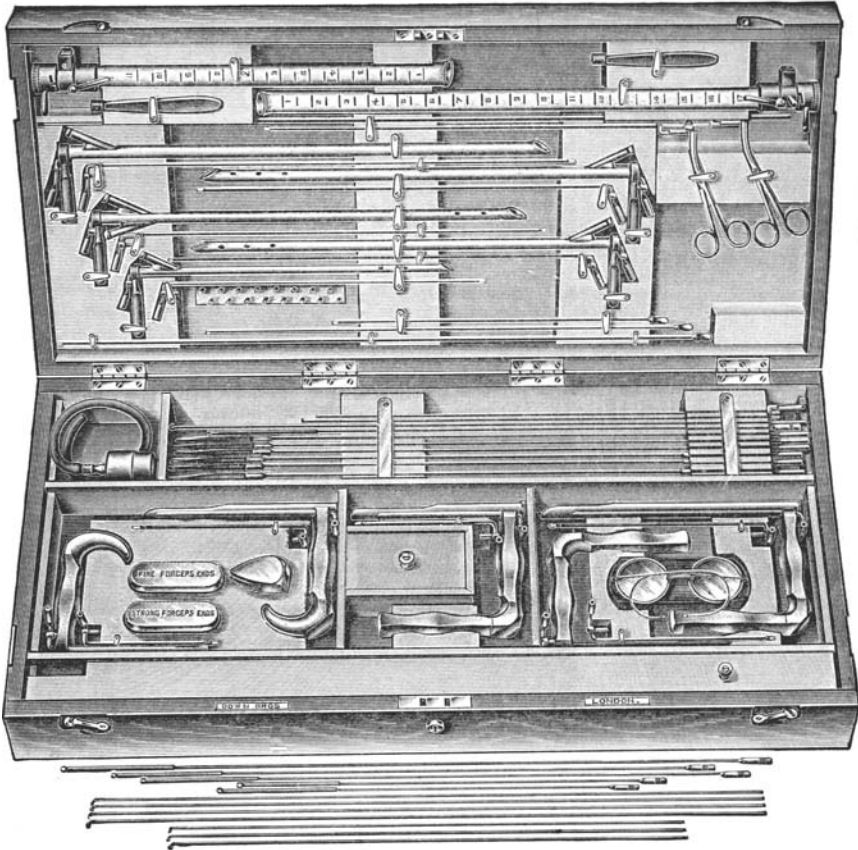

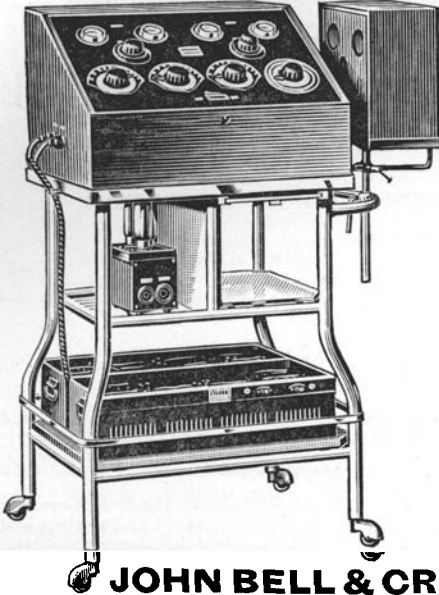

The Latest Model of the Audiometer originally exhibited at the Otological Congress at Copenhagen can now be demonstrated.

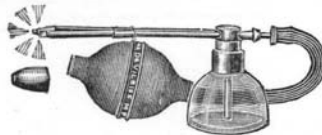

Major operations are performed daily, except Saturdays, in the In-patient Operating Theatres. Minor operations are performed in the Out-patient Department by the Assistant Surgeons on three mornings a week.

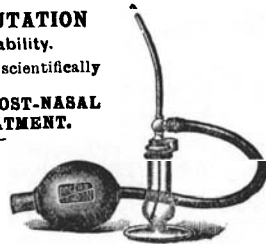
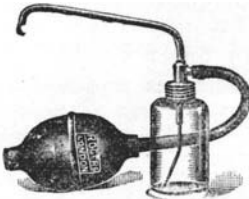
