In previous years such Fellowships have been offered for a six month period during the following twelve months but it is thought that some Senior Registrars wish to arrange their training programme for more than a year ahead and so on this occasion two consecutive Fellowships are being offered. The first will be tenable in 1988 and the second in 1989. Those applicants who are short-listed will be invited to meet the Trustees in London during November 1987 when both appointments will be made.

Applicants must be Fellows of one of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons and a Senior Registrar in Otolaryngology in an appointment recognized for Higher Surgical Training.
