
The Anthropological Studies Series of the Amsterdam Free University will this summer bring out as its sixth volume

Essays on the Role of Religion in Asia**

In this collection of essays, edited by Dick Kooiman, Otto van den Muijzenberg en Peter van der Veer, anthropologists and historians join forces to illuminate the intricate relations between religion and society in Asia.

Subjects range from the various strategies of Hindu priests in India and the political ambitions of Islamic leaders in Java to the early exploits of Dutch missionaries in Formosa. Data have been collected by a combination of participant observation, oral history research and archival studies. Despite this variety of subjects and research methods the articles show a common interest in the sometimes unexpected role played by religion in processes of social change in Asia.

This reader contains articles on India, Indonesia and Formosa by Tine Ruiter, Else Ensing, André Wink, Frans Husken, Leo Blussé, Dick Kooiman and Peter van der Veer.
