The *Journal of Asian Studies*, known until September 1956 as the *Far Eastern Quarterly*, is published by The Association for Asian Studies (formerly The Far Eastern Association) in November, February, May, and August. The annual institutional subscription rate is \$30.00, postage included. Subscribers also receive the annual *Bibliography* and semiannual *Professional Review*. Single issues of the *Journal* and *Bibliography*, beginning with the May 1965 issue, cost \$8.00 plus postage and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Earlier issues may be purchased from A.M.S. Reprints, 56 E. 13th Street, New York, New York 10003.

Annual membership dues are \$20.00 (\$10.00 for full-time students) payable April 1.
