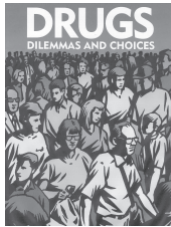


Corrigendum

‘true negatives’ and minimises ‘false positives’. In the same hypothetical screening study, a test that has a specificity of 90% will correctly classify 90% of ‘true negatives’ as not misusing alcohol.” The authors apologise for any confusion that may have arisen.

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
