Christopher M. Andrew & A. S. Kanya-Forstner. During the First World War and its immediate aftermath, France completed the process of building the second largest empire in world history. The climax of French empire-building has never before been fully analyzed, and it makes a remarkable story. Governments tend to lose control of their soldiers and officials at the outposts of empire, but the authors show that the French government lost control of imperial policy even in its own capital.
