BULLETIN OF ENTOMOLOGICAL RESEARCH.

NOTES FOR AUTHORS.

Papers submitted for publication should be sent to the Director, Imperial Institute of Entomology, British Museum (Natural History), Cromwell Road, London, S.W.7. They must deal with insects that are of economic importance, and they will ordinarily be published in order of receipt. Manuscripts should be typewritten, double spaced, on one side of the paper only and should be prepared with a current number of the "Bulletin" as a model in matters of form. Tables should be reduced to the simplest form and should not be used where text or illustrations give the same information.

Illustrations are accepted at the discretion of the Director. Original, clearly-lettered ink drawings are required for line reproduction. Unless carefully executed, numerals should not be made a permanent part of the figures. Small letters, not capitals, should be used for designation of parts of figures. Only white graph or white drafting paper should be used for figures and graphs. Text-figures, when reproduced, cannot exceed five inches in width. If, therefore, the original drawings are larger, the lettering on them must be in proportion, so that it is still legible when reduced. Photographs for reproduction as plates are admissible when they are a real contribution to the text.

Free copies of reprints are allowed as follows:—One author—30 copies; two or more authors—50 copies. Further copies may be obtained on payment, and the number required should be specified when submitting the paper.

ORDERS and subscriptions should be sent to the Assistant Director, Imperial Institute of Entomology, 41, Queen's Gate, London, S.W.7, or through a bookseller.

The subscription rate (*in advance*) is Thirty shillings a volume, post free; separate parts, Nine shillings each, post free.
