Graduate Essay Prize

The Hegel Society of Great Britain invites submissions to be considered for a Graduate Essay Prize. Applicants must be full-time or part-time MA or PhD students, PhD students in their continuation year, or PhD students who have submitted their theses during the academic year, 2002-03. Submissions are welcome from students in any discipline and from any country, but all essays should be written in English. Essays may deal with any aspect of Hegel's philosophy or his relation to other philosophers. They should be approx. 6,000 words long. No student may submit more than one essay. The submission deadline is October 1st, 2003. *Four* copies of each essay should be sent by this date to:
