This sophisticated analysis of migrant Tamil laborers, the first of its kind, focuses on a Malayan rubber plantation—from colonial times, through Japanese occupation in World War II, to independence. Concentrating on the changing influence of the social strata of the estate, the author discusses the values of equality and inequality in the social structure, economic organization, and political process on an estate worked by settled foreigners.
