Why have people in socialist China read and written literary works? *The Uses of Literature* looks broadly and empirically at the "uses" of literature from the points of view of authors, editors, political authorities, and several kinds of readers. Perry Link considers texts ranging from elite "misty" poetry to underground hand-copied volumes (*shouchauben*) and shows in concrete detail how people who were involved with literature sought to teach, learn, enjoy, explore, debate, lead, control, and resist.

Combining aspects of cultural and literary studies, *The Uses of Literature* will reward anyone interested in the literature of modern China or how creativity is affected by a "socialist literary system."

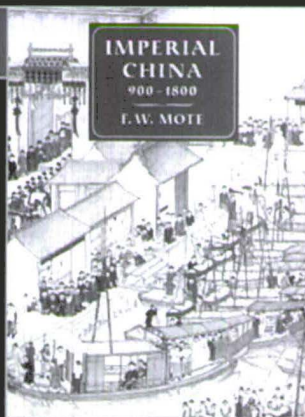
