Old Germanic Studies in the Low Countries and the Motivation and Methods of Jan van Vliet (1622-1666)

This volume deals with the study of Old Germanic languages in the Low Countries, in the 17th century. The work of the philologist and lawyer Jan van Vliet (1622-1666) has been taken as a starting point for a discussion of the intellectual background and philological methodology of 17th-century investigations into the earliest recorded forms of the Germanic languages.

Van Vliet's activities provide an extraordinary example of the earliest attempts to approach Old Germanic languages from a comparative point of view. The cosmopolitan tradition of philological studies in the Dutch Republic as well as Van Vliet's great admiration of Francis Junius (1590-1677), the founding-father of Germanic philology, formed the basis for his ideas about vernacular languages. His work allows us a unique insight in the pioneering 17th-century studies in Germanic philology.

The Impact of the Kabbalah in the Seventeenth Century

*The Life and Thought
of Francis Mercury van Helmont (1614-1698)*

"If he had lived among the Greeks, he would now be numbered among the stars." So wrote Gottfried Wilhelm Leibniz in his epitaph for Francis Mercury van Helmont, whose views influenced Leibniz, contributed to the development of modern science, and fostered the kind of ecumenicalism that made the concept of toleration conceivable.

The progressive nature of van Helmont's thought was based on his deep commitment to the esoteric doctrines of the Lurianic Kabbalah. He co-edited the *Kabbala Denudata* (1677-1684), the largest collection of Lurianic Kabbalistic texts available to Christians up to that time. Although difficult and arcane, its subject matter illuminates the faith in science, the belief in progress, and the pluralism characteristic of later western thought. The Lurianic Kabbalah thus deserves a place it has never received in histories of western scientific and cultural developments.

Witchcraft and Magic Trials in Southern Sweden, 1635-1754

Per Sörlin

This study deals with witchcraft and magic in a legal, social and cultural context, with an interpretation based on an extensive body of Swedish sources comprising more than 350 cases involving 880 individuals.

A majority of the trials took place during the 1700's.

The prosecution of witches was characterized by leniency resulting only in a few death sentences; a majority of the cases were minor events concerning more often innocuous magic rather than the witches' sabbath or maleficent witchcraft.

By focusing on the few prosecutions of maleficent witchcraft, this study promotes a critical discussion of how social and cultural perceptions of local witchcraft were generated by the interactions in the legal process, providing us with new insights into early modern European witchcraft.
