

NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF SINGAPORE

PROFESSORSHIP IN PHILOSOPHY

Applications are invited for appointment to a full professorship in the Department of Philosophy from candidates with considerable experience in teaching and research in the main areas of analytical philosophy (e.g. philosophical analysis, epistemology, metaphysics, philosophy of science, philosophy of mind) and who have published works of merit. The successful candidate will be expected to provide leadership in teaching and research programs and the general development of the Department.

Annual emoluments range from S\$91,490–141,780, the initial salary depending on the candidate's qualifications and experience. (U.S. \$1.00 = S\$2.15 approximately).

Under the University's Academic Staff Provident Fund Scheme, the staff member contributes at the present rate of 23% of the monthly salary subject to a maximum of S\$690 to the Fund, and the University contributes 22%. The sum standing to the staff member's credit in the Fund may be withdrawn upon departure from Singapore and Malaysia permanently. Other benefits: leave, medical care, a settling-in allowance of S\$1,000–S\$2,000, housing at subsidized rentals of S\$100 to S\$216 p.m., children's education allowance up to S\$12,000 p.a., passages and baggage allowance for the transportation of personal effects to Singapore. Staff may undertake consultation work, subject to University approval, and retain fees up to equivalent of 60% of annual gross salary in any one (1) year.

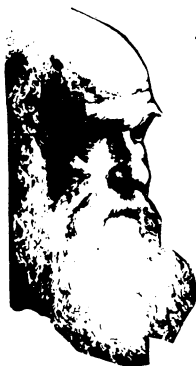
