Stories for Discussion

Each story has a series of questions for discussion. The stories are intended to suggest some point of Christian teaching which may serve as a subject for analysis and discussion after they have been read.

The method is simple. A story is read aloud by a group member. Then, using the questions, the whole group, under the guidance of the director, join in a round-table discussion of the Christian teaching implied.

The stories are varied and topical. Charity, chastity, obedience, marriage, Catholic education, delinquency, Catholic Action, vocation to the religious life and so on, are the topics treated.
